Georgia government has developed the strategy — “Digital Georgia: e-Georgia strategy and action plan 2014–2018” to provide a comprehensive framework for ICT and social development. The purpose of the Economics curricula modernization at TSU suggests transfer from simplified approach in economics teaching and learning to multidisciplinary, multifactor and practice-oriented one.*

**Introduction.** In the epoch of growing digitalization and rapid technological development traditional structure of public administration is not effective in new information society. Georgia

government has developed the strategy — “Digital Georgia: e-Georgia strategy and action plan 2014–2018” to provide a comprehensive framework for ICT and social development. According to UN E-Government Survey (2016) Georgia is at comparable level of e-government development and is 61<sup>st</sup> in the rating. There is a number of obstacles impeding progress connected to the e-governance strategy: lack of qualified personnel, clear concept and strategies including personnel training, teaching materials on modern technologies, advanced and interdisciplinary technologies/tools and etc.

The qualified personnel have to be prepared by HEIs based on advanced curricula, which must be realised by approach that e-governance is not only IT-technologies but also innovation, policy, fiscal frameworks, management and economy. To active effectiveness of e-governance in Georgia, Tbilisi State University as a leader HEI in Georgia should manage to adapt rapidly its resources management principles with global technological trends and provide qualified labor resources for public sector.

**Purpose.** The purpose of the Economics curricula modernization at TSU suggests transfer from simplified approach in economics teaching and learning to multidisciplinary, multifactor and practice-oriented one with intensity of e-governance courses and focus on automatization, rationalization and modernization in Curricula.

Based on the University mission, vision and strategy, it is committed to the development of modern knowledge, adaptation and spread of modern knowledge in the educational spaces of the Georgian and Caucasian regions, ensuring its competitiveness in the epoch of information technological revolution.
